A modest and unknown lawyer on the eve of the Revolution, Danton became a famous orator of the Cordeliers Club and was raised to governmental responsibilities as the French Minister of Justice following the fall of the monarchy on the tenth of August 1792, and was allegedly responsible for inciting the September Massacres. from the original on 7 November 2023. 222. 219. Betteridge's law of headlines In 2015, a study of 26,000 articles from 13 news Betteridge's law of headlines is an adage that states: "Any headline that ends in a question mark can be answered by the word no. " It is based on the assumption that if the publishers were confident that the answer was yes, they would have presented it as an assertion; by presenting it as a question, they are not accountable for whether it is correct or not. yes/no questions, 44 percent were answered "yes"; 34 percent "maybe"; and only 22 percent were answered "no"; c6f4ff3a1c

The law is named after Ian Betteridge, a British technology journalist who wrote about it in 2009. The maxim has been cited by other names since 1991, when a published compilation of Murphy's law variants called it "Davis's law", a name that also appears online without any explanation of who Davis was. It has also been referred to as the "journalistic principle" and in 2007 was referred to in commentary as "an old truism among journalists... c6f4ff3a1c
