Chester Barnard recognized that individuals behave differently when acting in their organizational role than when acting separately from the organization. Organizational behavior researchers study the behavior of individuals primarily in their organizational roles. One of the main goals of organizational behavior research is "to revitalize organizational theory and develop a better conceptualization... f9cbfe9754 Organizational culture influences how people interact, how decisions are made (or avoided), the context within which cultural artifacts are created, employee attachment, the organization's competitive advantage, and the internal alignment of its units. It is distinct from national culture or the broader cultural background of its workforce.... f9cbfe9754

Organizational culture communicate the new culture. It was used by managers, sociologists, and organizational theorists in the 1980s. Alternative terms include business culture, corporate culture and company culture. They must embody courage, flexibility, interpersonal skills, organization knowledge, and patience. These individuals must be catalysts Organizational culture encompasses the shared norms, values, and behaviors—observed in schools, not-for-profit groups, government agencies, sports teams, and businesses—reflecting their core values and strategic direction. Interpersonal communication In the psychological spaces, self-awareness and awareness of the emotions, cultures, and things that are not seen are also significant when communicating. It is essential to see the visual/nonverbal and verbal cues regarding the physical spaces. Some U.S. academic environments define leadership as "a process of social influence in which a person can enlist the aid and support of others in the accomplishment of a common and ethical task".
