Pallesthesia This sensation, often conducted through skin and bone, is usually generated by mechanoreceptors such as Pacinian corpuscles, Merkel disk receptors, and tactile corpuscles. Damage to the peripheral nervous system or central nervous system can result in a decline or loss of pallesthesia. All of these receptors stimulate an action potential in afferent nerves (sensory neurons) found in various layers of the skin and body. The afferent neuron travels to the spinal column and then to the brain where the information is processed. diminished sense of vibration is known as pallesthesia. standards imposed on a vehicle's ignition switch by the NHTSA, however, General Motors did create their own criteria. On February 6, 2014, General Motors (GM) recalled about 800,000 of its small cars due to faulty ignition switches, which could shut off the engine while the vehicle was in motion, thereby preventing the airbags from inflating. The company continued to recall more of its cars over the next several months, resulting in nearly 30 million cars being recalled worldwide and compensation being paid for 124 deaths. As part of a deferred prosecution agreement, GM agreed to forfeit \$900 million to the United States. The fault had been known to GM for at least a decade prior to the recall being declared. GM faced significant criticism and several lawsuits from the public and consumers for failing to issue a recall sooner in spite of their knowledge of the design flaw.

Shock and vibration data logger The shock and vibration data can be retrieved (or transmitted), viewed and evaluated after it has been recorded. Digital data is usually in the form of acceleration and time. A shock data logger or vibration data logger is a measurement instrument that is capable of autonomously recording shocks or vibrations over a defined period of time.

In contrast with a shock data logger, a shock detector is used to indicate whether or not the threshold of specified shock has occurred.

The use of condition monitoring allows maintenance to be scheduled, or other actions to be taken to prevent consequential damages and avoid its consequences.
