The circulatory system has two divisions, a systemic circulation or circuit, and a pulmonary circulation or circuit. Some sources use the terms cardiovascular system and vascular system interchangeably with circulatory system. Hemoglobin The worms's upper end is a deep-red fan-like structure ("plume"), which extends into the water and absorbs H₂S and O₂ for the bacteria, and CO₂ for Hemoglobin (haemoglobin, Hb or Hgb) is a protein containing iron that facilitates the transportation of oxygen in red blood cells. A healthy human has 12 to 20 grams of hemoglobin in every 100 mL of blood. CO₂. Hemoglobin is a metalloprotein, a chromoprotein, and a globulin. Hemoglobin in the blood carries oxygen from the respiratory organs (lungs or gills) to the other tissues of the body, where it releases the oxygen to enable aerobic respiration which powers an animal's metabolism. Almost all vertebrates contain hemoglobin, with the sole exception of the fish family Channichthyidae 576e202924

SEALAB The knowledge gained from the SEALAB expeditions helped advance the science of deep sea diving and rescue and contributed to the understanding of the psychological and physiological strains humans can endure. Marseilles, placed on September 14, 1962, and Conshelf II, placed in the Red Sea at depths of 11 and 27 m (36 and 89 ft) on June 15, 1963. Later that year SEALAB I, II, and III were experimental underwater habitats developed and deployed by the United States Navy during the 1960s to prove the viability of saturation diving and humans living in isolation for extended periods of time

When these zones cover a large area for an extended period of time, neither fish nor. dioxide (CO₂) sequestration from the atmosphere. HABs are sometimes defined as only those algal blooms that produce toxins, and sometimes as any algal bloom that can result in severely lower oxygen levels in

Saturation diving Once saturated, the time required for decompression to surface pressure will not increase with longer exposure. "15". The ratio of productive working time at depth to unproductive decompression time is thereby increased, and the health risk to the diver incurred by decompression is minimised. remote crew US Navy (2006). Archived from the original on 2 May 2008 Saturation diving is an ambient pressure diving technique which allows a diver to remain at working depth for extended periods during which the body tissues become saturated with metabolically inert gas from the breathing gas mixture. The diver undergoes a single decompression to surface pressure at the end of the exposure of several days to weeks duration.
