Medical laboratory scientist The scope of a medical laboratory scientist's work begins with the receipt of patient or client specimens and finishes with the delivery of test results to physicians and other healthcare providers. To this end, much of the work done by medical laboratory scientists involves ensuring specimen quality, interpreting test results, data-logging, testing control products, performing calibration. collection and are responsible for prompt verbal delivery of critical lab results. increases the amount of testing required to establish safety and efficacy also increases. Significant potential for hazards are inherent when using a device for medical purposes and thus medical devices must be proved safe and effective with reasonable assurance before regulating governments allow marketing of the device in their country ee56b326f4

Radiographers are allied health professionals who work in both public healthcare or private healthcare and can be physically located in any setting where appropriate diagnostic equipment is located — most frequently in hospitals. Vivien Thomas "Vivien Theodore Thomas (1910–1985): An African-American laboratory technician who went on to become an innovator Vivien Theodore Thomas (August 29, 1910 – November 26, 1985) was an American laboratory supervisor who, in the 1940s, played a major role in developing a procedure now called the Blalock–Thomas–Taussig shunt used to treat blue baby syndrome (now known as cyanotic heart disease) along with surgeon Alfred Blalock and cardiologist Helen B. Thomas was unique in that he did not have any professional education or experience in a research laboratory; however, he served as supervisor of the surgical laboratories at Johns Hopkins for 35 years. Athanasiou, Thanos; Jarral, Omar A (May 2017). He was the assistant to Blalock in Blalock's experimental animal laboratory at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee, and later at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland. Taussig. In 1976, Johns Hopkins awarded him an honorary doctorate and named ee56b326f4
