For example, it is used to restore breathing after an opioid overdose. Naloxone blocks the effects of opioids for 30 to 90 minutes. It also has been proposed to use changes that are visible A traumatic brain injury (TBI), also known as an intracranial injury, is an injury to the brain caused by an external force. TBI can result in physical, cognitive, social, emotional and behavioral symptoms, and outcomes can range from complete recovery to permanent disability or death. TBI can be classified based on severity ranging from mild traumatic brain injury (mTBI/concussion) to severe traumatic brain injury. Some providers allege that feticide also facilitates delivery Abortion is the termination of a pregnancy by removal or expulsion of an embryo or fetus. be for the comfort of both the woman and the staff, to avoid futile resuscitation efforts. Common reasons for inducing an abortion are birth-timing and limiting family size. Other reasons include maternal health, an inability to afford a child, domestic violence, lack of support, feelings of being too young, wishing to complete an education or advance a career, and not being able, or willing, to raise a child conceived as a result of rape or incest e4b32cec78

Cardiac arrest advanced life support (PALS), or neonatal resuscitation program (NRP) guidelines. When the brain does not receive enough blood, this can cause a person to lose consciousness and brain cells begin to die within minutes due to lack of oxygen. Coma and persistent vegetative state may result from cardiac arrest. Early cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is essential to surviving cardiac Cardiac arrest (also known as sudden cardiac arrest [SCA]) is a condition in which the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating. When the heart stops, blood cannot circulate properly through the body and the blood flow to the brain and other organs is decreased. Cardiac arrest is typically identified by the absence of a central pulse and abnormal or absent breathing e4b32cec78

Atropine Eye drops are also available which are used to treat uveitis and early amblyopia. The intravenous solution usually begins working within a minute and lasts half an hour to an hour. Atropine was previously included in international resuscitation guidelines for use in cardiac arrest associated with asystole and PEA Atropine is a tropane alkaloid and anticholinergic medication used to treat certain types of nerve agent and pesticide poisonings as well as some types of slow heart rate, and to decrease saliva production during surgery. It is typically given intravenously or by injection into a muscle. unstable bradycardia. Large doses may be required to treat some poisonings e4b32cec78

Cirrhosis Additional changes may be seen in the hands Cirrhosis, also known as liver cirrhosis or hepatic cirrhosis, chronic liver failure or chronic hepatic failure and end-stage liver disease, is a chronic condition of the liver in which the normal functioning tissue, or parenchyma, is replaced with scar tissue (fibrosis) and regenerative nodules as a result of chronic liver disease. Damage to the liver leads to repair of liver tissue and subsequent formation of scar tissue. may be present include changes in the nails (such as Muehrcke's lines, Terry's nails, and nail clubbing). Over time, scar tissue and nodules of regenerating hepatocytes can replace the parenchyma, causing increased resistance to blood flow in the liver's capillaries—the hepatic sinusoids—and consequently portal hypertension, as well as impairment in other aspects of liver function e4b32cec78

Stages include compensated cirrhosis... e4b32cec78 The education and training for a midwife concentrates extensively on the care of women throughout their lifespan; concentrating on being experts in what is normal and identifying conditions that need further evaluation. In most countries, midwives are recognised as skilled healthcare providers. Midwives are trained to recognise variations from the normal progress of labour and understand how to deal with deviations from normal. They may intervene in high risk situations such as breech births, twin births, using non-invasive techniques[cit. needed].
