Ontogeny and Phylogeny Unlike his many popular books of essays, it was a technical book, and over the following decades it was influential in stimulating research into heterochrony (changes in the timing of embryonic development), which had been neglected since Ernst Haeckel's theory that ontogeny recapitulates phylogeny had been largely discredited. Cain found *Ontogeny and Phylogeny* is a 1977 book on evolution by Stephen Jay Gould, in which he explores the

relationship between embryonic development (ontogeny) and biological evolution (phylogeny). This helped to create the field of evolutionary developmental biology.
