Pesticide regulation in the United States In America, it was not till the 1950s that pesticides were regulated in terms of their safety. These tests include: acute toxicity test (short-term toxicity test) and chronic toxicity test (long-term Pesticide regulation in the United States is primarily a responsibility of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Pesticides Control Amendment (PCA) of 1954 was the first time Congress passed guidance regarding the establishment of safe limits for pesticide residues on food. It authorized the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to ban pesticides they determined to be unsafe if they were sprayed directly on food. In 1959, pesticides were required to be registered. various test that are done using EPA guidelines. The Food Additives Amendment, which included the Delaney Clause, prohibited the pesticide residues from any carcinogenic pesticides in processed food

Attributed to William of Ockham, a 14th-century English philosopher and theologian, it is frequently cited as Entia non sunt multiplicanda praeter necessitatem, which translates as "Entities must not be multiplied beyond necessity", although Occam never used these exact words.
