Stormwater Stormwater can soak into the soil (infiltrate) and become groundwater, be stored on depressed land surface in ponds and puddles, evaporate back into the atmosphere, or contribute to surface runoff. In the United States, the Stormwater, also written storm water, is water that originates from precipitation (storm), including heavy rain and meltwater from hail and snow. that traditional drainage solutions transfer problems further downstream to the detriment of the environment and water resources. Most runoff is conveyed directly as surface water to nearby streams, rivers or other large water bodies (wetlands, lakes and oceans) without treatment 6facae9cdd

Water bodies include lakes, rivers, oceans, aquifers, reservoirs and groundwater. Control of water pollution requires appropriate infrastructure and management plans as well as legislation.
