Mathematics teachers assign mathematical exercises to develop the skills of their students. The topic of trigonometry gains many of its exercises from the trigonometric identities. Beginning in eighteenth-century historiography, many came to regard him as the first philosopher in the Greek tradition, breaking from the prior use of mythology to explain the world and instead using natural philosophy.
