Christian Science It was founded in 1879 in New England by Mary Baker Eddy, who wrote the 1875 book Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures, which outlined the theology of Christian Science. Adherents are commonly known as Christian Scientists or students of Christian Science, and the church is sometimes informally known as the Christian Science church. Practitioners wanting Christian Science is a set of beliefs and practices which are associated with members of the Church of Christ, Scientist. Their training is a two-week, 12-lesson course called “primary class”, based on the Recapitulation chapter of Science and Health. The book was originally called Science and Health; the subtitle with a Key to the Scriptures was added in 1883 and later amended to with Key to the Scriptures
