Santa Cruz Operation In 2001, the Santa Cruz Operation sold its rights to Unix and its Unix divisions The Santa Cruz Operation, Inc. and its successors and on the other side from the free and open source Linux. (usually known as SCO, pronounced either as individual letters or as a word) was an American software company, based in Santa Cruz, California, that was best known for selling three Unix operating system variants for Intel x86 processors: Xenix, SCO UNIX (later known as SCO OpenDesktop and SCO OpenServer), and UnixWare d120643121

Fork (software development) Software built from a fork initially has identical behavior as software built from the original code, but as the source code is increasingly modified, the resulting software tends to have increasingly different behavior compared to the original. Reasons for forking a codebase include user preference, stagnated or discontinued development of the original software or a schism in the developer community. Forking proprietary software (such as Unix) is prohibited by copyright law without explicit permission. A fork is a form of branching, but generally involves storing the forked files separately from the original; not in the repository.
