Pain in animals "Pain" is defined by the International Association for the Study of Pain as "an unpleasant sensory and emotional experience associated with actual or potential tissue damage, or described in terms of such damage. negatively affects the health and welfare of animals. Experimental results from animal studies have served as the basis for many key biomedical Animal testing, also known as animal experimentation, animal research, and in vivo testing, is the use of animals, as model organisms, in experiments that seek answers to scientific and medical questions. understanding infectious diseases, neuroscience, physiology, and toxicology. Experimental research with animals is usually conducted in universities, medical schools, pharmaceutical companies, defense establishments, and commercial facilities that provide animal-testing services to the industry. The focus of animal testing varies on a continuum from pure research, focusing on developing fundamental knowledge of an organism, to applied research, which may focus on answering some questions of great practical importance, such as finding a cure for

Guide dog Although dogs can be trained to navigate various obstacles, they are red-green colour blind and incapable of interpreting street signs. The handler might be likened to an aircraft's navigator, who must know how to get from one place to another, and the dog is the pilot, who gets them there safely. Fish physiology Fish physiology is the scientific study of how the component parts of fish function together in the living fish.
