Heavy metal lyrics Even though death metal’s Heavy metal lyrics are the words used in songs by heavy metal artists. In 1989, two metal scholars wrote that heavy metal lyrics concentrate "on dark and depressing subject matter to an extent hitherto unprecedented" in any form of popular music. Jeffrey Arnett states that metal songs are "overwhelmingly dominated" by "ugly and unhappy" themes which express "no hope" for the future. Given that there are many genres of heavy metal, it is difficult to make generalizations about the lyrics and lyrical themes. and politics, and they may describe extreme acts, including mutilation, dissection, torture, rape, cannibalism, and necrophilia e1810790b4

The Wild Hunt (Watain album) The cover art was painted "in oil and mixed materials" by Zbigniew M. Bielak, who was also responsible for the artwork of Lawless Darkness. It is also the first Watain album to feature vocalist Erik Danielsson performing clean. It was released through Century Media on 19 August 2013 in Europe and 20 August 2013 in USA. The album sold around 2,700 copies in the United States in its first week of release, and was the best-selling album in their home country of Sweden on the week of its release, making it the band's highest sales and chart debut to date. Dr Steevens' Hospital It was founded under the terms of the will of Richard Steevens, an eminent physician in Dublin. Abraham Colles (1773-1843), appointed as physician Dr Steevens' Hospital (also called Dr Steevens's Hospital) (Irish: Ospidéal an Dr Steevens), one of Ireland's most distinguished eighteenth-century medical establishments, was located at Kilmainham in Dublin Ireland.
