Macroevolution While human evolution from their primate ancestors did not require massive morphological changes, our Macroevolution comprises the evolutionary processes and patterns which occur at and above the species level. However, the exact usage of the term has varied throughout history. This is the common definition for 'macroevolution' used by contemporary scientists. The evolution of new species (speciation) is an example of macroevolution. shorter limbs with 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 or no toes at all. In contrast, microevolution is evolution occurring within the population(s) of a single species. In other words, microevolution is the scale of evolution that is limited to intraspecific (within-species) variation, while macroevolution extends to interspecific (between-species) variation 1414d16def

Sir Wilfrid Le Gros Clark was one of the primatologists who developed the idea of trends in primate evolution and the methodology Primates is an order of mammals, which is further divided into the strepsirrhines, which include lemurs, galagos, and lorises; and the haplorhines, which include tarsiers and simians (monkeys and apes). Primates arose 74–63 million years ago first from small terrestrial mammals, which adapted for life in tropical forests: many primate characteristics represent adaptations to the challenging environment among tree tops, including large brain sizes, binocular vision, color vision, vocalizations, shoulder girdles allowing a large degree of movement in the upper limbs, and opposable thumbs (in most but not all) that enable better grasping and dexterity. Primates are capable of high levels of cognition; some make tools and use them to acquire foods and for social displays; some have sophisticated hunting strategies requiring cooperation, influence and rank; they are status conscious, manipulative and capable of deception; they can recognise kin and conspecifics; they can learn to use symbols and understand aspects of human language including some relational syntax, concepts of number and numerical sequence. 1414d16def

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
