Bowel obstruction Causes of bowel obstruction include adhesions, hernias, volvulus, endometriosis, inflammatory bowel disease, appendicitis, tumors, diverticulitis Bowel obstruction, also known as intestinal obstruction, is a mechanical or functional obstruction of the intestines that prevents the normal movement of the products of digestion. admission to hospital. IBS can negatively affect quality of life and may result in missed school or work or reduced productivity at work. Disorders such as anxiety, major depression, and myalgic encephalomyelitis/chronic fatigue syndrome (ME/CFS) are common among people with IBS. of inflammatory bowel disease. Management of Crohn's disease ""Cannabis-based drugs could offer new hope for inflammatory bowel disease patients"" Management of Crohn's disease involves first treating the acute symptoms of the disease, then maintaining remission. However, surgery cannot cure Crohn's disease. Since Crohn's disease is an immune system condition, it cannot be cured by medication or surgery. Treatment initially involves the use of medications to eliminate infections (generally antibiotics) and reduce inflammation (generally aminosalicylate anti-inflammatory drugs and corticosteroids). However, the disease often returns even after surgery. This involves removing the affected part of the intestine and reconnecting the healthy sections. PMID 15230268. Journal of Gastroenterology.
