Army Act This use of the crown's prerogative by Charles I in a contentious manner (the crown's right to make and enforce rules for the military) caused Parliament to pass the Petition of Right in 1628. by the British Government as auxiliary to the British Army, making them British military units, but not acknowledged as parts of the British Army. Because the articles of war did not fall under these court's jurisdiction, military law could not be applied to anyone in England, whether soldier or civilian. This Act stated that neither civilians nor soldiers and officers who were in England during peace were subject to military courts or law. The Parliament Until 1689, mutiny was regulated in England by Articles of War instituted by the monarch and effective only in a period of war. Only common-law courts and courts of equity could exercise authority over individuals in peacetime England 8887b1049e
