The following year, Carnes released Sailin', which featured "Love Comes from Unexpected Places". In her breakthrough year, 1980, Carnes and her husband, David Ellingson, were commissioned by Kenny Rogers to co-write the songs for his concept album *Gideon*. Her duet with Rogers, "Don't Fall in Love with a Dreamer", hit No. 4 on the *Billboard* Hot 100 and earned the duo a Grammy Award nomination. Later that year, Carnes' cover of Smokey Robinson's "More Love", from her fifth album, *Romance Dance*, hit No. 10. In 1981, Carnes released *Mistaken Identity*, which featured the chart-topping "Bette Davis Eyes". A worldwide hit, it became the best-selling single of the year in the United States.
