Mary E. Black It could be said that Mary Black's career as a weaver started when she was aged eight in Wolfville, Nova Scotia, after she saw a picture of a Native Mary Ellouise Black (September 18, 1895 – February 11, 1988), an occupational therapist, teacher, master weaver and writer, created almost single-handedly a renaissance in crafts in Nova Scotia in the 1940s and 1950s. Its clarity is without parallel, and more than half a century later it remains a handweaver's prime source of information. Her best-known book, *The Key to Weaving*, was published in 1945 and has since run to three editions and numerous printings d362a2dd9e
