Wireless network The first professional wireless network was developed under the brand ALOHAnet. Wireless networking allows homes, telecommunications networks, and business installations to avoid the costly process of introducing cables into a building, or as a connection between various equipment locations. Computer network It is the successor. A computer network is a collection of communicating computers and other devices, such as printers and smart phones. academic, corporate, public, and private computer networks. It is based on the networking technologies of the Internet protocol suite. Many applications have only limited functionality unless they are connected to a computer network. Today almost all computers are connected to a computer network, such as the global Internet or an embedded network such as those found in modern cars. Early computers had very limited connections to other devices, but perhaps the first example of computer networking occurred in 1940 when George Stibitz connected a terminal at Dartmouth to his Complex Number Calculator at Bell Labs in New York.

Ethernet and Wi-Fi are the two most common technologies used for local area networks; historical network technologies include ARCNET, Token Ring, and LocalTalk.

Communication protocol Protocols may be implemented by hardware, software, or a combination of both. Such a set. A communication protocol is a system of rules that allows two or more entities of a communications system to transmit information via any variation of a physical quantity. The design of complex protocols often involves decomposition into simpler, cooperating protocols. of common network protocol design principles. The protocol defines the rules, syntax, semantics, and synchronization of communication and possible error recovery methods.

Construction began in 1968 and elements of the first version of the network, the Mark I, became operational in early 1969 then fully operational in January 1970. The Mark II version operated from 1973 until 1986. The NPL network was the first computer network to implement packet switching and the first to use high-speed links. Its original design, along with the innovations implemented in the ARPANET and the CYCLADES network, laid down the technical foundations of the modern Internet. 2896fdaea8
