White rhinoceros The species includes two subspecies with dramatically different conservation outlooks: the southern white rhinoceros, with an estimated 17,464 individuals in the wild as of the end of 2023, and the

northern white rhinoceros. populations exist within the subspecies; historical range in Namibia, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Uganda, and Eswatini, with a small population also surviving. The white rhinoceros, also known as the white rhino or square-lipped rhinoceros (*Ceratotherium simum*), is the largest extant species of rhinoceros and the most social of all rhino species, characterized by its wide mouth adapted for grazing. Both subspecies have faced significant threats, primarily from poaching for their horns and habitat loss, which contribute to the species' overall decline. The northern subspecies is critically endangered and on the brink of extinction; its last known male, Sudan, died in March 2018, leaving behind only a very small number of females in captivity.

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
