Structuration theory Its proponents have adopted and expanded this balanced position. Though the theory has received much criticism, it remains a pillar of contemporary sociological theory. The theory was proposed by sociologist Georges Gurvitch and later refined by Anthony Giddens, most significantly in *The Constitution of Society*, which examines phenomenology, hermeneutics, and social practices at the inseparable intersection of structures and agents. Indeed, smartphones collect and compile an increasing amount of sensitive information to which access must be controlled to protect the privacy of the user and the intellectual property of the company... A key measure in information theory is entropy. Entropy quantifies the amount of uncertainty involved in the value of a random variable or the outcome of a random process. For example, identifying the outcome of a fair coin flip (which has two equally likely outcomes) provides less information (lower entropy, less uncertainty) than identifying the outcome from a roll... The growing significance of computer insecurity reflects the increasing dependence on computer systems, the Internet, and evolving wireless

network standards. This reliance has expanded with the proliferation of smart devices, including smartphones, televisions, and other components of the Internet of things (IoT).
