Accounting information system The most widely adopted accounting information systems are auditing and financial reporting modules. An accounting information system is generally a computer-based method for tracking accounting activity in conjunction with information technology resources. Accounting information systems are designed to support all accounting functions and activities including auditing, financial accounting reporting, - managerial/ management accounting and tax. The resulting financial reports can be used internally by management or externally by other interested parties including investors, creditors and tax authorities. Whole-life cost Costs considered include the financial cost which is relatively simple to calculate and also the

environmental and social costs which are more difficult to quantify and assign numerical values. Whole-life cost analysis is often used for option evaluation when procuring new assets and for decision-making to minimize whole-life costs throughout. Whole-life cost is the total cost of ownership over the life of an asset. Typical areas of expenditure which are included in calculating the whole-life cost include planning, design, construction and acquisition, operations, maintenance, renewal and rehabilitation, depreciation and cost of finance and replacement or disposal. The concept is also known as life-cycle cost (LCC) or lifetime cost, and is commonly referred to as "cradle to grave" or "womb to tomb" costs.

Reconciliation (accounting) Reconciliation is used to ensure that the money leaving an account matches the actual money spent. "The generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) are a set of accounting principles, procedures and standards that organisations follow in accounting, reconciliation is the process of ensuring that two sets of records (usually the balances of two accounts) are in agreement. It is a general practice for businesses to create their balance sheet at the end of the financial year as it denotes the state of finances for that period. This is done by making sure the balances match at the end of a particular accounting period, monthly, or annual basis."
