Systematic review Systematic reviews, sometimes along with meta-analyses, are generally considered the highest level of evidence in medical research. For example, a systematic review of randomized controlled trials is a way of summarizing and implementing evidence-based medicine. A systematic review extracts and interprets data from published studies on the topic (in the scientific literature), then analyzes, describes, critically appraises and summarizes interpretations into a refined evidence-based conclusion. mixed-methods reviews that adhere to standards for gathering, analyzing, and reporting evidence. Scientific inquiry includes creating a testable hypothesis through inductive reasoning, testing it through experiments and statistical analysis, and adjusting or discarding the hypothesis based on the results. Historically, it was developed through the centuries from the ancient and medieval world. The scientific method involves careful observation coupled with rigorous skepticism, because cognitive assumptions can distort the interpretation of the observation

Metascience Research in scientific data science includes Metascience (also known as meta-research) is the use of scientific methodology to study science itself. Metascience seeks to increase the quality of scientific research while reducing inefficiency. Metascience concerns itself with all fields of research and has been described as "a bird's eye view of science". but we can do it better. is the use of data science to analyse research papers. It is also known as "research on research" and "the science of science", as it uses research methods to study how research is done and find where improvements can be made

registering the hypotheses, methods, or analyses of a scientific study before it is conducted. Finally, registered reports include the peer review and in principle acceptance of a study protocol prior to data collection

Preregistration has the goal to transparently evaluate the severity of hypothesis tests, and can have a number of secondary goals (which can also be achieved without preregistering), including (a) facilitating and documenting research plans, (b) identifying and reducing questionable research practices and researcher biases, (c) distinguishing between confirmatory and exploratory analyses, and, in the case of Registered Reports...

Research opposed to the classical scientific methods. These activities are characterized by accounting and controlling for biases. To test the validity of instruments, procedures, or experiments, research may replicate elements of prior projects or the project as a whole. A research project may be an expansion of past work in the field. It involves the collection, organization, and analysis of evidence to increase understanding of a topic, characterized by a particular attentiveness to controlling sources of bias and error. As such, it is similar to the social sciences in using qualitative research and intersubjectivity as tools to apply Research is creative and systematic work undertaken to increase the stock of knowledge
