Ford Fiesta (fifth generation) This was the first Fiesta to be sold in Asia and Australasia, where it replaced the Kia-based Festiva. The Fiesta continued to be built in Mexico until 2010 and in Brazil until 2014. This generation became the best-selling Ford Fiesta generation to date. Most engines were carried over from the previous Fiesta.
