Bass drums are built in a variety of sizes, but size does not dictate the volume produced by the drum. The instrument is typically cylindrical, with the drum's diameter usually greater than its depth, with a struck head at both ends of the cylinder. Bass drums are percussion instruments that vary in size and are used in several musical genres. The heads may be made of calfskin or plastic and there is normally a means of adjusting the tension, either by threaded taps or by strings. The pitch and the sound can vary much with different sizes, but the size is also chosen based on convenience and aesthetics.
