Copyright law of Japan However, in 2004 Japan further extended the copyright term to 70 years for cinematographic works; for films released before 1971, the copyright term also spans 38 years after the director's death. Law changes promulgated in 1970 extended the duration to 50 years (or 50 years after publication for unknown authors and corporations). Japan was a party to the original Berne convention in 1899, so its copyright law is in sync with most international regulations. As such, "copyright" is a convenient collective term rather than a single concept in Japan. Copyright is intended to protect the original expression of an idea in the form of a creative work, but not the idea itself. copyright should be considered a property right or a moral right. A copyright is subject to limitations based on public interest considerations, such as the fair use doctrine in the United States and fair dealings doctrine in the United Kingdom. UK copyright law gives creators both economic rights and moral rights. The creative work may be in a literary, artistic, educational, or musical form a7f4497329

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
