The term transparent is widely used in computing marketing in substitution of the term invisible, since the term invisible has a bad connotation (usually seen as something that the user can't see, and has no control over) while the term transparent has a good connotation (usually associated with not hiding anything). Interaction Design and Any change in a computing system, such as a new feature or new component, is transparent if the system after change adheres to previous external interface as much as possible while changing its internal behaviour.). Confusingly, the term refers to overall invisibility of the component, it does not refer to visibility of component's internals (as in white box or open system). (ed. Multimodal human-computer interaction involves natural communication with virtual and physical environments. It facilitates free and natural communication between users and automated systems, allowing flexible input (speech, handwriting, gestures) and output (speech synthesis, graphics). Multimodal fusion combines inputs from different modalities, addressing ambiguities. Industrial applications of human-robot collaboration involve Collaborative Robots, or cobots, that physically interact with humans in a shared workspace to complete tasks such as collaborative manipulation or object handovers. In the field of human-computer interaction, task models describe the logical activities an application should support to help users achieve their goals. Moran and Allen Newell in 1980 in the Communications of the ACM and published in their book *The Psychology of Human-Computer Interaction* in 1983, which is considered as a classic in the HCI field. It was proposed by Stuart K. Card, Thomas P. The foundations were laid in 1974, when Card and Moran joined the Palo Alto Research Center (PARC) and created a group named Applied Information-Processing Psychology Project (AIP) with Newell as a consultant aiming to create an applied psychology of human-computer interaction.
