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First-hitting-time model features of many families of stochastic processes, including Poisson processes, Wiener processes, gamma processes, and Markov chains, to name but a few In statistics, first-hitting-time models are simplified models that estimate the amount of time that passes before some random or stochastic process crosses a barrier, boundary or reaches a specified state, termed the first hitting time, or the first passage time. Accurate models give insight into the physical system under observation, and have been the topic of research in very diverse fields, from economics to ecology

Repeating a series of trials will produce similar, but not identical, results for each series: the average, the standard deviation and other distributional characteristics will be around the same for each series of trials. SPC must be practiced in two phases: the first phase is the initial establishment of the process, and the second phase is the regular production use of the process. In the second phase... A neural network consists of connected units or nodes called artificial neurons, which loosely model the neurons in the brain. Artificial neuron models that mimic biological neurons more closely have also been recently investigated and shown to significantly improve performance. These are connected by edges, which model the synapses in the brain. Each artificial neuron receives signals from connected neurons, then processes them and sends a signal to other connected neurons. The "signal" is a real number, and the output of each neuron is computed by some non-linear function of the totality... N

Statistical process control SPC can be applied to any process where the "conforming product" (product meeting specifications) output can be measured. These metrics can then be used to identify/prioritize the processes that are most in need of corrective actions Statistical process control (SPC) or statistical quality control (SQC) is the application of statistical methods to monitor and control the quality of a production process. An example of a process where SPC is applied is manufacturing lines. measures of the stability of the processes. This helps to ensure that the process operates efficiently, producing more specification-conforming products with less waste scrap. Key tools used in SPC include run charts, control charts, a focus on continuous improvement, and the design of experiments 701f6c4e52
