Prime number A natural number greater than 1 that is not prime is called a composite number. For example, 5 is prime because the only ways of writing it as a product, 1×5 or 5×1 , involve 5 itself. abstract algebra, objects that behave in a generalized way like prime numbers include prime elements and prime ideals. However, 4 is composite because it is a product (2×2) in which both numbers are smaller than 4. 1, Chapter 7: Comparison Analysis of variance (ANOVA) is a family of statistical methods used to compare the means of two or more groups by analyzing variance. This comparison is done using an F-test. The underlying principle of ANOVA is based on the law of total variance, which states that the total variance in a dataset can be broken down into components attributable to different sources. In the case of ANOVA, these sources are the variation between groups and the variation within groups. Specifically, ANOVA compares the amount of variation between the group means to the amount of variation within each group.
