While they were reported to have been literate, they are believed to have been prevented by doctrine from recording their knowledge in written form. The oldest detailed description comes from Julius Caesar's Commentarii de Bello Gallico (50s BC). Druids left no written accounts. The druids were religious leaders as well as legal authorities, adjudicators, lorekeepers, medical professionals and political advisors. Their beliefs and practices are attested in some detail by their contemporaries from other cultures, such as the Romans and the Greeks 9991f83261

Tragedy That tradition has been multiple and discontinuous, yet the term has often been used to invoke a powerful effect of cultural identity and historical continuity—"the Greeks and the Elizabethans, in one cultural form; Hellenes and Christians, in a common activity,". While many cultures have developed forms that provoke this paradoxical response, the term tragedy often refers to a specific tradition of drama that has played a unique and important role historically in the self-definition of Western civilization. the supernatural, suicide, blood and gore. Traditionally, the intention of tragedy is to invoke an accompanying catharsis, or a "pain [that] awakens pleasure," for the audience.
