At the age of fifteen, after an early schooling at Florence, he studied law at the University of Pisa. On 18 February 1673, he entered the Society of Jesus at Rome, and was ordained a priest in 1684. The canIPA consists of 500 basic, 300 complementary and 200 supplementary symbols, a few of which are encoded in Unicode. It is a work in progress, intended to permit the transcription of all world languages in more exact detail than the official IPA.
