The paired observations may be designated x and y . For comparisons of paired observations (x, y) , the sign test is most useful if comparisons can only be expressed as $x > y$, $x = y$, or $x < y$. If, instead, the observations can be expressed as numeric quantities ($x = 7$, $y = 18$), or as ranks (rank of $x = 1$ st, rank of $y = 8$ th), then the paired t-test can be used. When census data (comprising every member of the target population) cannot be collected, statisticians collect data by developing specific experiment designs and survey samples...

The consequences of such misinterpretations can be quite severe. In some cases, the misuse may be accidental. In others, it is purposeful and for the gain of the perpetrator. Chapter 11, Title 11, United States Code In Chapter 7, the business ceases operations, a trustee sells all of Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code (Title 11 of the United States Code) permits reorganization under the bankruptcy laws of the United States. a federal bankruptcy court for protection under either Chapter 7 or Chapter 11. In contrast, Chapter 7 governs the process of a liquidation bankruptcy, though liquidation may also occur under Chapter 11; while Chapter 13 provides a reorganization process for the majority of private individuals.
