APA style APA style is widely used, either entirely or with modifications, by hundreds of other scientific journals, in many textbooks, and in academia. The first edition of the APA Publication APA style (also known as APA format) is a writing style and format for academic documents such as scholarly journal articles and books. In 1944, a 32-page guide appeared as an article in the same journal. Historically, scribes who were paid to copy documents may have been literate, but many were simply copyists, mimicking the shapes of letters without necessarily understanding what they meant. This means that unintentional alterations were common when copying manuscripts by hand.
