Salt (chemistry) Because all solutions are electrically neutral, the two solutions mixed must In chemistry, a salt or ionic compound is a chemical compound consisting of an assembly of positively charged ions (cations) and negatively charged ions (anions), which results in a compound with no net electric charge (electrically neutral). mixing two solutions, one containing the cation and one containing the anion. Analytical chemistry In practice, separation, identification or quantification may constitute the entire analysis or be combined with another method. Most often the other technique is some form of chromatography. Analytical chemistry studies and uses instruments and methods to separate, identify, and quantify matter. Separation isolates analytes. Feldspar Feldspars make up about 60% of the Earth's crust and 41% of the Earth's continental crust by weight. anorthite endmember $\text{CaAl}_2\text{Si}_2\text{O}_8$ Solid solutions between orthoclase and albite are called alkali feldspar. The most common members of the feldspar group are the plagioclase (sodium-calcium) feldspars and the alkali (potassium-sodium) feldspars. Nonmetal Chemically, nonmetals have relatively high electronegativity or usually attract electrons in a chemical bond with another element, and their oxides tend to be acidic. They

range from colorless gases like hydrogen to shiny crystals like iodine. Feldspars crystallize from magma as both intrusive and extrusive igneous rocks and are also present in many types of metamorphic rock. Rock formed almost entirely of calcic plagioclase feldspar is known as anorthosite. Feldspars are also found in many types of sedimentary rocks. Mixture A mixture is the physical combination of two or more substances in which the identities are retained and are mixed in the form of solutions, suspensions or colloids. Mixtures

are one product of mechanically blending or mixing chemical substances such as elements. In chemistry, a mixture is a material made up of two or more different chemical substances which can be separated by physical method. They are mixed in the form of solutions, suspensions or colloids. It is an impure substance made up of 2 or more elements or compounds mechanically mixed together in any proportion.

Analytical chemistry consists of classical, wet chemical methods and modern analytical techniques. Classical qualitative methods use separations such as precipitation, extraction, and distillation. Identification may be based on differences in color, odor, melting point, boiling point, solubility, radioactivity or reactivity. Classical quantitative analysis uses mass or volume changes to quantify amount. Instrumental... Hydroxylamine and its salts are consumed almost exclusively to produce Nylon-6. The oxidation of NH_3 to hydroxylamine is a step in biological nitrification. The component ions in a salt can be either inorganic, such as chloride (Cl^-), or organic, such as acetate (CH_3COO^-). Each ion can be either monatomic, such as sodium (Na^+) and chloride (Cl^-) in sodium chloride, or polyatomic, such as ammonium (NH_4^+) and carbonate (CO_3^{2-}) ions in ammonium carbonate. Salts

containing basic ions hydroxide (OH^-) or oxide (O^{2-}) are classified as bases, such as sodium hydroxide and potassium oxide. Individual ions within a salt usually have multiple...
