These include Ecclesiastical Latin in Roman Catholicism, Hebrew in Judaism, Arabic in Islam, Avestan in Zoroastrianism, Sanskrit in Hinduism, and Punjabi in Sikhism. By contrast Buddhism and Christian denominations outside of Catholicism do not generally regard their sacred languages as sacred in themselves. e67912cc75 Classical languages are usually extinct languages. Ancient South Arabian The earliest preserved records belonging to the group are dated to the beginning of the 1st millennium BCE. They were written in the Ancient South Arabian script. Script, or Ms3nd, consisting of 29 graphemes concurrently used for proto-Ge'ez in the Kingdom of D'mt, ultimately sharing a common origin with the other Ancient South Arabian (ASA; also known as Old South Arabian, Epigraphic South Arabian, Sayhadic, or Yemenite) is a group of four closely related extinct languages (Sabaean/Sabaic, Qatabanic, Hadramitic, Minaic) spoken in the far southern portion of the Arabian Peninsula e67912cc75
