As part of both national and international legal frameworks, environmental law seeks to balance environmental preservation with economic and social needs, often through regulatory mechanisms, enforcement measures, and incentives for compliance ed570eb5

Brownfield regulation and development Revitalization Act. The pollutants such as heavy metals, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB), poly- and per-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), and volatile organic compounds (VOCs) contaminating these sites are typically due to commercial or industrial work that was previously done on the land. This includes locations such as abandoned gas stations, laundromats, factories, and mills. The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act was passed in 1976 and is the federal government's approach to the regulation of hazardous waste Brownfields are defined by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as properties that are complicated by the potential presence of pollutants or otherwise hazardous substances. By a process called land revitalization, these once polluted sites can be remediated into locations that can be utilized by the public ed570eb5

Resource Management Act 1991 The RMA promotes the sustainable management of natural and physical resources such as land, air and water. The FAR is issued by the FAR Council, a body composed of the Secretary of Defense, the GSA Administrator, and the NASA Administrator. This council meets quarterly or more frequently as needed, and the FAR may be updated multiple times per year. ed570eb5

At the local level, regulation usually is supervised by environmental agencies or the broader public health system. Water resource policy varies by region and is dependent on water availability or scarcity, the condition of aquatic systems... ed570eb5 The RMA and the decisions made under it by district and regional councils and in courts affect both individuals and businesses in large numbers, and often in very tangible ways. The Act has variously been attacked for being ineffective in managing adverse environmental effects, or overly time-consuming and expensive and concerned with bureaucratic restrictions on legitimate economic activities. ed570eb5

Resource curse There are many theories and much academic debate about the reasons for and exceptions to the adverse outcomes. The idea that resources might be more of an economic The resource curse, also known as the paradox of plenty or the poverty paradox, is the hypothesis that countries with an abundance of natural resources (such as fossil fuels and certain minerals) have lower economic growth, lower rates of democracy, or poorer development outcomes than countries with

fewer natural resources. As of at least 2023, there is no academic consensus on the effect of resource abundance on economic development. 2023, there is no academic consensus on the effect of resource abundance on economic development. Most experts believe the resource curse is not universal or inevitable but affects certain types of countries or regions under certain conditions ed570eb5
