Sun bear The sun bear is listed as vulnerable on the IUCN Red List, and is included in CITES Appendix I. The sun bear gets its name from its characteristic orange to cream-coloured chest patch. gains by the trade. With the exception of Sarawak (Malaysia) The sun bear (*Helarctos malayanus*) is a bear species in the family Ursidae found in the tropical forests of Southeast Asia. The fur is generally short and jet black, but can vary from grey to red. It is stockily built, with large paws, strongly curved claws, small, rounded ears and a short snout. It is the only species in the genus *Helarctos* and the smallest bear species, standing nearly 70 cm (28 in) at the shoulder and weighing 25–65 kg (55–143 lb). Its unique morphology—inward-turned front feet, flattened chest, powerful forelimbs with large claws—suggests adaptations for climbing e2de4680be

Loggerhead sea turtle The average loggerhead measures around 90 cm (35 in) in carapace length when fully grown. The adult loggerhead sea turtle weighs approximately 135 kg (298 lb), with the largest specimens weighing in at more than 450 kg (1,000 lb). The skin ranges from yellow to brown in color, and the shell is typically reddish brown. sea turtles are classified as vulnerable by the International Union for Conservation of Nature and are listed under Appendix I of the Convention on International The loggerhead sea turtle (*Caretta caretta*) is a species of oceanic turtle distributed throughout the world. It is a marine reptile, belonging to the family Cheloniidae. No external differences in sex are seen until the turtle becomes an adult, the most obvious difference being the adult males have thicker tails and shorter plastrons (lower shells) than the females e2de4680be

Leatherback sea turtle It can easily be differentiated from other modern sea turtles by its lack of a bony shell; instead, its carapace is covered by oily flesh and flexible, leather-like skin, for which it is named. It is the only living species in the genus *Dermochelys* and family Dermochelyidae. Immersion in water and exposure to high ambient pressure have physiological effects that limit the depths and duration possible in ambient pressure diving.
