Plutonium When exposed to moist air, it forms oxides and hydrides that can expand the sample up to 70% in volume, which in turn flake off as a powder that is pyrophoric. It is radioactive and can accumulate in bones, which makes the handling of plutonium dangerous. It is a silvery-gray actinide metal that tarnishes when exposed to air, and forms a dull coating when oxidized. generally believed that the color is a function of chemical purity, stoichiometry, particle size, and method of preparation, although the color resulting Plutonium is a chemical element; it has symbol Pu and atomic number 94.
