The three agents are theoretical constructs that Freud employed to describe the basic structure of mental life as it was encountered in psychoanalytic practice. According to Sigmund Freud, personality develops through a series of childhood stages in which pleasure-seeking energies from the child become focused on certain erogenous areas. Sigmund Freud proposed that if the child experienced frustration at any of the psychosexual developmental stages. An erogenous zone is characterized as an area of the body that is

particularly sensitive to stimulation. The erogenous zone associated with each stage serves as a source of pleasure. The five psychosexual stages are the oral, the anal, the phallic, the latent, and the genital. stage(in the oral stage , the id is fully present ,the ego begins to emerge and the super ego is not yet developed), every action is based upon the pleasure In psychoanalysis, psychosexual development is a central element of the sexual drive theory eab1c45b97

Sigmund Freud, the founder of psychoanalytic theory, developed the concept of resistance as he worked with patients who suddenly developed uncooperative behaviors during the analytic session. Freud reasoned that an individual that is suffering from a psychological affliction, which in psychoanalytic theory is derived from the presence of repressed illicit impulses or thoughts, may engage in efforts to impede attempts to confront such unconscious impulses or thoughts.
