Tool use by non-humans Wild tool use in other primates, especially among apes and monkeys, is considered relatively common, though its full extent remains poorly Tool use

by non-humans is a phenomenon in which a non-human animal uses any kind of tool in order to achieve a goal such as acquiring food and water, grooming, combat, defence, communication, recreation or construction. There is considerable discussion about the definition of what constitutes a tool and therefore which behaviours can be considered true examples of tool use. Originally thought to be a skill possessed only by humans, some tool use requires a sophisticated level of cognition. A wide range of animals, including mammals, birds, fish, cephalopods, and insects, are considered to use tools. related to humans 1b1eee7dcc

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
