Race (human categorization) By the 17th century, the term began to refer to physical (phenotypical) traits, and then later to national affiliations. Modern science regards race as a social construct, an identity which is assigned based on rules made by society. Officers are instructed to "record the response that has been given" even if the person gives an answer which may be incorrect; Race is a categorization of humans based on shared physical or social qualities into groups generally viewed as distinct within a given society. While partly based on physical similarities within groups, race does not have an inherent physical or biological meaning. The concept of race is foundational to racism, the belief that humans can be divided based on the superiority of one race over another.
