Laboratory quality control Quality control material should approximate the same matrix as patient specimens, taking into account properties such as viscosity, turbidity, composition, and color. Laboratory quality control is designed to detect, reduce, and correct deficiencies in a laboratory's internal analytical process prior to the release Laboratory quality control is designed to detect, reduce, and correct deficiencies in a laboratory's internal analytical process prior to the release of patient results, in order to improve the quality of the results reported by the laboratory. Laboratory quality control material is usually run at the beginning of each shift, after an instrument is serviced, when reagent lots are changed, after equipment calibration, and whenever patient results seem inappropriate. Quality control (QC) is a measure of precision, or how well the measurement system reproduces the same result over time and under varying operating conditions. It should 173d402e25

All instruments have an upper and a lower working limit. Concentrations below the working limit do not provide enough signal to be useful, and concentrations above the working limit provide too much signal to be useful. When calibrating an instrument for use, the experimenter must be familiar with both the lower and upper working range of the chosen instrument; results obtained from a sample of concentration outside the working range are often statistically uncertain. 173d402e25

Forensic chemistry In addition to the standard operating procedures proposed by the group, specific agencies have their own standards regarding the quality assurance and Forensic chemistry is the application of chemistry and its subfield, forensic toxicology, in a legal setting. These include high-performance liquid chromatography, gas chromatography-mass spectrometry,

atomic absorption spectroscopy, Fourier transform infrared spectroscopy, and thin layer chromatography. A forensic chemist can assist in the identification of unknown materials found at a crime scene. Specialists in this field have a wide array of methods and instruments to help identify unknown substances. Forensic chemists prefer using nondestructive methods first, to preserve evidence and to determine which destructive. The range of different methods is important due to the destructive nature of some instruments and the number of possible unknown substances that can be found at a scene

While quality by design principles have been used to advance product and process quality in industry, and particularly the automotive industry, they have also been adopted by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for the discovery, development, and manufacture of drugs. The analytical parameters selected are chosen to be appropriate for the decision-making process or to establish acceptable normality. The concept aims at understanding the processes by defining their CPPs, and accordingly monitoring them in a timely manner (preferably in-line or on-line) and thus being more efficient in testing while at the same time reducing over-processing, enhancing consistency and minimizing rejects. The FDA has outlined a regulatory framework for PAT implementation. With this framework – according to Hinz – the FDA tries to motivate the pharmaceutical industry to improve the production process. Analytical quality control Fields such as industry, medicine, and law enforcement can make use of AQC. Constituents submitted to the analytical laboratory must be accurately described to avoid faulty interpretations, approximations, or incorrect results. In the chemical sense, quantitative analysis refers to the measurement of the amount or concentration of an element or chemical compound in a matrix that differs from the element or compound.
