Copernicus likely developed his model independently of Aristarchus of Samos, an ancient Greek astronomer who had formulated such a model some eighteen centuries earlier 27b990bf1e

Isaac Newton Newton was a key figure in the Scientific Revolution and the Enlightenment that followed. S. 20 March] 1727) was an English polymath active as a mathematician, physicist, astronomer, alchemist, theologian, and author. S. obliquely with a spinning motion curved in flight. Newton contributed to and refined the scientific method, and his work is considered the most influential. Newton also made seminal contributions to optics, and shares credit with German mathematician Gottfried Wilhelm Leibniz for formulating infinitesimal calculus, though he

developed calculus years before Leibniz. His book *Philosophiæ Naturalis Principia Mathematica* (Mathematical Principles of Natural Philosophy), first published in 1687, achieved the first great unification in physics and established classical mechanics
