Skylab Operations included an orbital workshop, a solar observatory, Earth observation and hundreds of experiments. Skylab's orbit eventually decayed and it disintegrated in the atmosphere on July 11, 1979, scattering debris across the Indian Ocean and Western Australia. It was operated by three trios of astronaut crews: Skylab 2, Skylab 3, and Skylab 4. In 1962, NASA first considered the potential Skylab was the United States' first space station, launched by NASA, occupied for about 24 weeks between May 1973 and February 1974. Dendrochronology Dendrochronology derives from the Ancient Greek dendron (δένδρον), meaning "tree", khronos (χρόνος), meaning "time", and -logia (-λογία), "the study of".
