Liver tumors can be classified as benign (non-cancerous) or malignant (cancerous) growths. They are fluid-filled contained structures within the liver. Liver cysts are common. They may be discovered on medical imaging (even for a different reason than the cancer itself), and the diagnosis is often confirmed with liver biopsy. Simple Liver tumors (also known as hepatic tumors) are abnormal growth of liver cells on or in the liver. Several distinct types of tumors can develop in the liver because the liver is made up of various cell types dee5e7d351

Liver transplantation is highly regulated and only performed at designated transplant medical centers by highly trained transplant physicians. Involuntary organ harvesting was once legal on criminals, but outlawed in 2015. Growing concerns about possible ethical abuses arising from coerced consent and corruption led medical groups and human rights organizations, by the 1990s, to condemn the practice. These concerns resurfaced in 2001, when a Chinese asylum-seeking doctor testified that he had taken part in organ extraction operations. dee5e7d351

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
