

Who Was Thomas Alva Edison

Edison was born in Milan, Ohio, but grew up in Michigan with little formal schooling. He became deaf as a child and learned through books and tinkering. Edison began working at a young age; as a railroad telegrapher, he spent much of his time inventing improvements to telegraph systems. By the age of 22, he had sold a few of his early inventions and moved to New York City to focus on engineering. He had three children with his first wife, Mary, but Edison was neglectful. She died at 29 years old. Edison had troubled relationships with his children for the rest of his life. With the help of friends, the inventor attracted investment and grew his company. Alva Bradley was the owner of the Cleveland Indians in the 1940s and helped start what became Case Western Reserve University. Morris Bradley was the only son of Capt. The original Edison High School building was opened in 1903 as the all-male Northeast Manual Training High School located at 8th Street and Lehigh Avenue, which eventually became Northeast High School. New additions, such as the auditorium and vocational education shops, were added over the next three decades. Northeast High School reopened at a new location in 1957, and Thomas Alva Edison High School was opened at the site. The school remained all-male until the beginning of the 1979 school year. L. 105-331 (text) (PDF)) was introduced in the House of Representatives by Paul Gillmor of Ohio on February 11, 1997. Earlier proposals were submitted to commemorate 150th anniversary of Edison's February 11, 1847 birth in a prior Congress but were not passed. The bill would pass the House the following year on September 9, 1998, and was passed by the Senate on October 7, 1998. President Bill Clinton signed the bill into law on October 31, 1998. The law authorized the production of a silver dollar to commemorate the life of Edison and the 125th anniversary of the invention of the light bulb in 2004. The act allowed the coins to be struck in both proof and uncirculated finishes, and stated that no more than 500,000 coins would be minted. 9cd04112bb Edison himself was not present; it was announced he was "engaged in important government service". 9cd04112bb == Plot == 9cd04112bb Mina Miller was born on July 6, 1865, in Akron, Ohio to inventor and industrialist Lewis Miller and homemaker Mary Valinda Alexander. Through her lifelong involvement with the Chatauqua Institution, of which her father was a founder and leader, Mina spent the summers at Chautauqua from the age of 9 to her marriage to Edison. There a young Mina came in contact with many progressive orators, male and female who were interested in education reform, temperance, and women's suffrage.
