Petrochemical feedstock like ethylene and propylene can also be produced directly by cracking crude oil without the need of using refined products of crude oil such as naphtha. Advanced oxidation process Additionally Advanced oxidation processes (AOPs), in a broad sense, are a set of chemical treatment procedures designed to remove organic (and sometimes inorganic) materials in water and wastewater by oxidation through reactions with hydroxyl radicals ($\cdot\text{OH}$). biologically toxic or non-degradable materials such as aromatics, pesticides, petroleum constituents, and volatile organic compounds in wastewater. Common AOP configurations often include Fenton and photo-Fenton systems, in addition to ozone/UV, TiO_2/UV photocatalysis, and Electro-Fenton systems. In practice within wastewater treatment, this term usually refers more specifically to a subset of such chemical processes that employ ozone (O_3), hydrogen peroxide (H_2O_2) and UV light or a combination of the few processes 3101febf4
