Program analysis can be performed without executing the program (static program analysis), during runtime (dynamic program analysis) or in a combination of both. Program analysis focuses on two major areas: program optimization and program correctness. The first focuses on improving the program's performance while reducing the resource usage while the latter focuses on ensuring that the program does what it is supposed to do. The term is often used in contrast to declarative programming, which focuses on what the program should accomplish without specifying all the details of how the program should achieve the result. A computer program in its human-readable form is called source code. Source code needs another computer program to execute because computers can only execute their native machine instructions. Therefore, source code may be translated to machine instructions using a compiler written for the language. (Assembly language programs are translated using an assembler.) The resulting file is called an executable. Alternatively, source code may execute within an interpreter written for the language.
