Checklist A more advanced checklist would be a schedule, which lays out tasks to be done according to time of day or other factors, or a pre-flight checklist for an airliner, which should ensure a safe take-off. hospital found that the checklist highlighted limitations with frailty assessment in acute care and motivated teams to review routine practices, but that A checklist is a type of job aid used in repetitive tasks to reduce failure by compensating for potential limits of human memory and attention. They help to ensure consistency and completeness in carrying out a task. A basic example is the "to do list". Checklists are used both to ensure that safety-critical system preparations are carried out completely and in the correct order, and in less critical applications to ensure that no step is left out of a procedure

Human factors include both the non-technical skills that enhance safety and the non-technical factors that contribute to undesirable incidents that put the diver at risk.

Human factors in diving safety The safety of underwater diving operations can be improved by reducing the frequency of human error and the consequences when it does occur. include situational assessment and decision making under stress. Appropriate stress response, or coping, is a cognitive process which evaluates a stress Human factors are the physical or cognitive properties of individuals, or social behavior which is specific to humans, and which influence functioning of technological systems as well as human-environment equilibria. Human error can be defined as an individual's deviation from acceptable or desirable practice which culminates in undesirable or unexpected results

Barotrauma The initial damage is usually due to over-stretching the tissues in tension or shear, either directly by an expansion of the

gas in the closed space or by pressure difference hydrostatically transmitted through the tissue. Rapid uncontrolled decompression from caissons, airlocks, pressurised aircraft Barotrauma is physical damage to body tissues caused by a difference in pressure between a gas space inside, or in contact with, the body and the surrounding gas or liquid. The term is usually applied when the gas volume involved already exists prior to decompression. formation and other related injury. The Byford Dolphin incident is an example. Barotrauma can occur during both compression and decompression. Tissue rupture may be complicated by the introduction of gas into the local tissue or circulation through the initial trauma site, which can cause blockage of circulation at distant sites or interfere with the normal function of an organ by its presence 26d3a1ab26

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
